ELECTIVES (12 credits for Plan A or 18 credits for Plan B)

- Elective options include 300-600 level courses as approved by the faculty advisor.
- Courses may be taken from the Department of Construction Management or other programs from across campus.
- A minimum of 1 CON graduate elective course (which cannot be CON 684 or CON 695) is required for Plan A.
- A minimum of 2 CON graduate elective courses (which cannot be CON 684 or CON 695) are required for Plan B.
- A maximum of 3 credits of CON 695 are allowed.
- A maximum of 3 credits of CON 684 are allowed.
- Courses should enhance the student's knowledge in a chosen topic and complement the student's graduate coursework and research interests.
